Is it mandatory to be a part of a previous cooperation network built with the call closing in Dec. 15th? (INCOBRA Call EU-BR Bilateral Networks) Or is it possible to submit future proposals without being one of the 5 winners of this grant?

What are the differences between the "two stages" of the calls? What should be provided at the first stage, and what should be provided in the second?

How many, let's say, 'winners', will be granted with each proposal? One? I understand that a wide variety of nanomaterials exist currently, so for a wide gathering of data a significant amount of nanomaterials should be studied concomitantly.
